Greenway Projects Move Steadily Along

The major projects which are currently underway have seen consistent progress since the last newsletter.

- Constructions on GATES-CRESCENT PARK is fully underway and site improvements along the pathway should be finished by mid-September. Irrigation system installation will be the next phase of improvement with soil placement to occur in mid-October. At this printing, it appears that the Children's Museum will not begin construction in this park until next spring.
- THE SOUTH TRAIL EXTENSION, which extends from Wesley Avenue to the Denver City limit at Bates Avenue, has gone through the bid and award process for construction on this portion of the path. L and M Construction has been awarded the bid for the construction, which will begin at the end of August and should conclude by late November.
- The construction award for THE NORTHWEST TRAIL CONNECTION has gone to Abbott Construction Company. The construction schedule for this portion of the Greenway Trail is the same as the south portion. The Northwest connection will begin at 19th Street, continue along Rockmont Drive, go under I-25 and terminate at Jason Street. This connection will now give cyclist and pedestrians from Northwest Denver easy access onto the Greenway trail.

Volunteers Needed

Some new areas of volunteer work are being pursued. In addition to some upcoming cleanup and repair work from the GIRL, CUB, and BOYSCOUTS this fall, the County Court Probation System and the Greenway Foundation have joined forces. As an alternative to paying court-designated fines, individuals are allowed to work off the amount owed via community service. In each case the individual contacts the Greenway and is assigned to various areas of the river to help rid the site of litter, refuse, etc. The Greenway acknowledges and appreciates the Trail Ranger program and the City Parks crew assigned to the Greenway for their assistance in helping locate needed cleanup areas. We would also like to thank Mr. Jack Nelson of the County Court Probation System for his assistance in getting this program of cooperative effort underway.

Summer On The Platte – 1982

This summer the Greenway bicycle path and park system have seen numerous activities. On May 16th the Great Relay Race was held and attracted close to 400 participants. This year's race was sponsored by Miller Lite, OP Sunwear, Pants and Duds, KBPI Radio, and the Denver Magazine. The race had sections competing from the north and south. The top three winners from each section were: **(North)** — 1) Wright-McLaughlin Engineers, 2) Environmental Protection Agency, 3) Yerkey North; **(South)** — 1) Adams County, 2) Denver Water Board, 3) Yerkey South.

Following the Great Relay Race, the Trail Ranger program began with college students responsible for maintenance of the trail. The rangers estimate that during the noon hour, daily and on weekends, there are several hundred individuals using the trail . . . biking, walking, skating, boating, or just enjoying a stroll along the river.

Daily raft trips have run throughout the summer. Arkansas River Tours have carried users of the Greenway on the unique inner-city waterway throughout Denver, giving them a very different view of the city.

The Concerts on the Green as well as the Denver Civic Band have provided the wonder of music on the river's banks. The summer still offers excellent close-in recreation and we hope you'll take advantage of the warm days left as well as the beauty of Indian Summer on the river.
